#### WHAT ARE COOKIES?

A cookie is a small text file which is placed onto your device (e.g. computer, smartphone or other electronic device) when you use our Website. These help us to recognise you and your device and store some information about your preferences or past actions.

For example, we may monitor how many times you visit the website, which pages you go to, traffic data, location data and the originating domain name of your internet service provider. Such information helps us understand how we can improve our services and/or products and services to meet your needs; deliver relevant website content and help you quickly find information relevant to you on our Website; and use data analytics to improve our Website, client relationships and experiences through research, statistical analysis and behavioural analysis.

#### TYPES OF COOKIES

**Session cookies** – are temporary files stored on your device and erased from your device when you close your browser. These allow websites to link actions of a user in a single browser session for example they will make sure that any items placed in virtual shopping baskets are transferred to a checkout or keep you logged in as you move through private sections of a website.

**Persistent cookies** – are stored on devices for either a long time or a time limited period. They are only deleted when they expire or when you delete cookies from your device. These are used to remember user inputs and settings for example, log in information so you don't have to log in on your next visit. They can also be used to collect information about your interests and choices and other organisations creating a user profile to enable targeted marketing.

**First party cookies** – These cookies are set by the website you're visiting. And only that website can read them.

**Third party cookies** – are set by a domain other than the one being visited for example Google and if you have been browsing google.com prior to visiting our Website google may set certain cookies including those set out below. Please be aware that these cookies may change from time to time and we have no control over the operation of these cookies. For information of third party cookies please see the table set out below and follow the link for further information regarding the use of data by **Google**.

First-party cookie	_gid Universal Analytics (Google)	This is a web analytics service provided by Google Inc which uses cookies to show us how visitors found and explored our site, and how we can enhance their experience. It provides us with information about the behaviour of our visitors (e.g. how long they stayed on the site, the average number of pages viewed) and also tells us how many visitors we have had.	1 day
First-party cookie	_gat	This cookie is used to throttle analytics requests to limit requests being sent from a user's browser to Google.	1 minute
First-party cookie	_fuid	The _fuid cookie allows a website to track visitor behaviour on the sites on which the cookie is installed. Tracking is performed anonymously until a user identifies himself by submitting a form.	10+ years
Third Party Cookie	ANID	The "ANID" cookie is used for advertising served across the web and stored in google.com.	1 year
Third Party Cookie	DV	Used to collect information about how a user uses the website.	7 minutes
Third Party Cookie	1P_JAR	This cookie carries out information about how the end user uses the website and any advertising that the end user may have seen before visiting the website.	1 month
Third Party Cookie	NID	This cookie is set by DoubleClick (which is owned by Google) to help build a profile of a user's interests and show you relevant ads on other sites.	1 month
Third Party Cookies	CONSENT	If the user hasn't been to a google.com domain before visiting the Cosworth website these cookies won't appear. But if a user ticks the captcha checkbox, the NID cookie mentioned above will be set.	2 years
